Deadline

The deadline for receipt of proposals is June 1st, 2011. Presenter selections will be made no later than July 31st, 2011. Lead presenters will receive acknowledgement of proposal submission and final selection by email.

Discount

Workshop presenters whose proposals are accepted will receive a discount of \$100 off the full conference registration fee.

Instructions

Please read the instructions carefully. Proposals must include all items listed below:

1. Presenter information including name, title, organization, work address, phone number and email address. If there is more than one presenter, please indicate the lead presenter.
2. Presenter bio including name, title and organization to be used in conference program and/or website, if accepted (no more than 25 words).
3. Title of presentation.

4. Length of presentation: 60 or 90 minutes. We will make best efforts to honor your preferred time slot; please be advised that you may be asked to adjust presentation length.
5. A workshop description to be used in the conference program and/or website, if accepted (no more than 50 words).
6. An abstract of the workshop that includes rationale, importance of topic and relevance to sexuality education (no more than 150 words).
7. One to two learning objectives that describe what the participants should be able to do after attending the workshop. Objectives must be SMART. Guidance on SMART objectives is included on page two of this document.
8. An outline that details the procedural steps of your workshop. Be sure to include the various teaching methodologies you will use. Examples of methodologies include brainstorm, small group work, role plays, and other engaging activities.
9. Any audio/visual requirements required.
10. Presenter resume/CV.

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What are SMART objectives?

Specific – Objectives should clearly state what they want to achieve.

Measurable – You should be able to measure whether you are meeting the objectives or not.

Achievable – Are the objectives you set, achievable and attainable?

Realistic – Can you realistically achieve the objectives with the resources you have?

Time – Will you be able to achieve your objectives within the allotted amount of time?

Examples of SMART Objectives:

By the end of this workshop participants will be able to:

- Name three common STI's contracted by teens.
- Describe two factors that might lead to risk-taking behavior.
- Explain the procedural steps for teaching one STI prevention activity.
